The V3P web platform was created upon request from middle-income countries needing access to more transparent vaccine price information and up-to-date guidance on procurement practices.

The price database and repository increases in value each time a country voluntarily submits vaccine price information.

THE VACCINE PRODUCT PRICE AND PROCUREMENT PROJECT




The **V3P** web-platform is a “one-stop-shop” for information and tools countries need to make informed decisions about vaccine introduction and procurement.


The web-platform is made up of three parts:

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1 Price Database

A vaccine price database that countries can use to share and compare procurement, product and price information.

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2 Information Repository

A repository of information created by V3P including presentations, guidance documents and analyses.

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3 Resource Gateway

A comprehensive set of links to information available on the Internet on vaccine product, price and procurement.

How to participate:

1 Identify Focal Point

To get started, identify a focal point who will be responsible for uploading data and communicating with V3P.

This focal point should be knowledgeable about the country’s procurement system, have access to recent price information, and have a clear understanding of the terms of purchasing agreements.

Learn all the factors that constitute price

A variety of factors influence the prices a country pays for vaccines, including product attributes, volume ordered, vaccine delivery points, Incoterms, transport and insurance charges, the procurement mechanism and suppliers used, general contractual information, taxation, and fees. By exploring how these factors influence price, countries can negotiate the best possible terms in their agreements.

Explore options for products and procurement methods

No two procurement systems are exactly alike, yet some are better than others. By understanding how programme and procurement strategies can impact price, countries can assess the strengths and weaknesses of their own procurement systems and adjust accordingly.

See what other countries are paying for vaccines

V3P allows users to search, compare, and analyse prices and terms that other countries have negotiated for their vaccines. Price transparency gives countries a benchmark for reasonable vaccine prices, useful for both existing and future procurement decisions.

2 Enter and view data

To enter data, the focal point must first register a user name on the V3P price database. To get there:
